- The PVMA will review the above submissions and advise Olds College that all requirements have been met. Only at that time will Olds College process your registration and your payment.   - □ Gloves CSA approved.

- Work boots sport/street shoes are not acceptable.
- Hard hat certified to CSA standard Z94.1-92 (Class E Industrial Headwear) with hearing protection and face shield and separate eye protection.
- Calculator with basic math functions.
- Handsaw
- Optional (if possible): topping saw (light weight) & bucking saw (20" bar).
